About Dig-iT

Community volunteer support group:

- We offer regular support drop-ins for dyslexic people of all ages and their families, for mutual support, information, advice and activities.
- We aim to raise awareness of dyslexia, its characteristics, cooccurrences and its wide ranging impact on society.
- We collaborate with other voluntary and statutory bodies.
- Promote practical solutions for people that are affected by dyslexia.
- Volunteers and committee members include dyslexic adults.
- We want to develop from the 'bottom up' to meet local need.

How we began

- Three parents with children at school got together.
- One-off 'drop-in' held in Philip Dix Centre in Sept 2011.
- 25 families attended a group was needed.
- Monthly drop-ins started at Carnegie Centre in Jan 2012
- Dig-iT became a constituted group in April 2012.
- Additional drop-ins with Community Cafe at Kerria Centre from Autumn 2012.
- Dig-iT:Adults began in September 2014

Families supported / contacts

- 344 people on general mail out list since January 2012 (325 on the list last year - up by 14)
- 27 new families contacted us April 2015-March 2016 (34 last year. Down 21%)
- Carnegie Centre: 15% (4 initial enquiries. Down 57%)
- Dig-iT:Adults group: 11% (3 initial enquiries 8 last year as a new group)
- Outreach (events/website/email): 74% (20 initial enquiries. Up by 5%)
- People referred from other agencies: 13% (13 people 6 last year. Up by 116%)



Support groups

- Average no. of families at Carnegie drop-in = 4 (No change since last year)
- Average no at Dig-iT:Adults: = 5 (No change since last year)
- Trend shows initial contacts reducing at Carnegie drop-in due to:
 - Increase in contacts via Dig-iT:Adults
 - Direct referrals from other organisations
 - Increase in contacts via 'outreach' & phone / email methods



Reasons for contact

- Adult = 7 contacts (26%)
- Child = 20 contacts (74%)
- Education = 21 contacts (78%)
 - □ Primary school = 76%
 - □ Secondary school = 14%
 - \Box College = 5%
 - \Box University = 5%
- Employment = 3 contacts (11%)
- General info = 6 contacts (22%)



Dyslexia screening

- Number of child dyslexia screenings: = 12 (8 last year 50% increase)
 Outcomes:
 - High risk = 1 (8.3%)
 - Moderate risk = 7 (58.3%)
 - Low risk = 4 (33.3%)
- Number of adult dyslexia screenings: = 8 (4 last year 100% increase)



Common enquiries

- Screening assessments = 63%
- Diagnostic assessment = 7%
- Dyslexia traits = 14%
- Literacy help & tips = 15%
- Help at school = 11%
- Help at work = 0%
- Getting a statement = 7%
- Other = 19%

Policy issues

Dig-iT:

- Collated SEN support stats relating to Tamworth's primary & secondary schools, to bring to attention of Tamworth Borough Council elected members:
 - Worrying trend of unexpectedly uneven proportions of SEN at high schools (given nature of catchment areas)
 - Lower than expected levels of registered SEN in some primary schools.
 - The need to encourage schools to attain Dyslexia Friendly Status at the higher level.
- Organised meeting with parents Borough Councillor to discuss concerns on difficulties getting assessment at schools and timely help.
- Provided information on dyslexia stats and experiences of local people regarding dyslexia at request of Christopher Pincher MP to support his application for a House of Commons debate on early identification and support for dyslexia.



Challenges

- Loss of Kerria Centre
- Impending loss of Carnegie Centre
- Developing a youth group
- Reduction in community engagement events due to budget cuts
 - Community venues
 - Community development workers
 - PCOs (no longer have area social media accounts)



Future ideas

- Positively Different 2016 collaboration with local businesses & community groups?
- New 'positive' information leaflets / website links (inspired by Twitter user request for ways to make a 'label' positive)
- More collaborative work with local schools (new links with Lakeside Primary School).
- Drop-in relocation (Possibly with Community Together CIC / St Editha's Hall?
- Additional Drop-ins at new locations (Glascote Heath alongside Community Together CIC)
- Volunteers to further support activities and events







Conclusions

- Dyslexia is a disorder on the language continuum; not all children with dyslexia have co-occurring language disorder/LI but many experience language delay
- Phonological and broader language skills predict individual differences in word-level reading skills
- The risk of dyslexia is elevated in children at family risk and children with preschool LI
- Targeted interventions can be delivered in school to foster language and literacy development (without 'waiting for children to fail')
- Teaching assistants in mainstream schools and early years staff should be trained, supported and mandated to deliver oral language work
